Stewardship Moment

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Jesus minces no words with his disciples: If we acknowledge Jesus publicly, Jesus will remember us before God, our Father. If we deny Jesus, he will forget us. It is very rare that a Christian will denounce Jesus publicly. But we can deny Jesus in more subtle ways. There are many people who conveniently forget all about Jesus Christ and the work of his Kingdom in their daily lives, in moments of weakness, spiritual immaturity or when times get tough. Good stewards strengthen their confession of Christ by praying and attending Mass regularly, examining their lives and going to confession frequently, and reminding themselves daily that Christ resides in them. Take a look at your own daily life. Do you acknowledge Christ before others? How often do you remind yourself that Jesus lives in you?

Hay mucha gente que olvida, convenientemente, todo lo que se refiere a Jesús y al trabajo de su Reino en sus vidas diarias, en los momentos de debilidad, de inmadurez espiritual o cuando enfrentan tiempos difíciles. Los buenos corresponsables fortalecen su confesión de Cristo a través de la oración y asistiendo regularmente a Misa, examinando sus vidas y acudiendo a la confesión con frecuencia, y recordándose diariamente a sí mismos que Jesús vive en ellos/as. Dedique un tiempo para dar una mirada a su propia vida diaria. ¿Reconoce usted a Cristo ante otros? ¿Con qué frecuencia recuerda que Cristo vive en usted?

Liturgy of the Hours

From ancient times the Church has had the custom of celebrating each day The Liturgy of the Hours (also known as The Divine Office). Psalms, readings from Holy Scripture, hymns, and prayers are offered at regular intervals throughout the day. As such, the Liturgy of the Hours is a complement to the fullness of divine worship that is contained in the Eucharistic Sacrifice, so that worship might overflow to reach all the hours of daily life.

The Office is not only for those in holy orders or consecrated life; all Christ's faithful members are encouraged to participate since it is the prayer of the whole people of God. Where possible, it is encouraged that the principal Hours (Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer) should be celebrated communally in church by groups of the faithful. The Second Vatican Council stated "Pastors of souls should see to it that the chief hours, especially Vespers, are celebrated in common in church on Sundays and the more solemn feasts." In response to that call, beginning on June 25th, we will have a communal celebration of Evening Prayer every Sunday at 5:30pm.

If you've never prayed the Liturgy of the Hours before (or even if you have), please come 15 minutes early on June 25th, and Fr. Hans will go over how it is prayed. All are welcome!

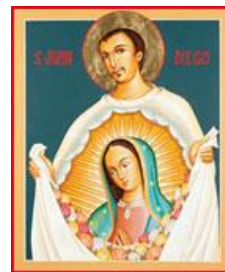
