Stewardship Moment

Fifth Sunday of Lent. If your parish does not celebrate the Mass for the Third Scrutiny for catechumens, you may hear the Gospel story of Jesus inviting his disciples into a great mystery with curious pronouncements: Those who love their lives just as they are will lose them. If a grain of wheat dies, it will bear much fruit... What does Jesus mean? The climactic event of Jesus' passion and death is drawing closer; a time when the great confrontation between Jesus and the powers of darkness take place. When Jesus is lifted up, he will draw all to himself. The Christian steward knows life can't be lived in complacency. We are called to die to self, bear more fruit, be raised up with Jesus. Jesus brings discomfort to those who are comfortable. Jesus urges us to give witness in his name. How will we respond?

Quilts

St. Juan Diego Ministers having been taking Communion and offering prayer to Catholic patients at Kaiser Westside Hospital since it opened and work closely with their chaplains. Over the past 10 plus years, we have visited over 5,000 Catholic patients. Father Hans is often called by the chaplains to visit patients that are in need of a priest.

Through the years, SJD has provided rosaries for the chaplains to give if the patient request one. The chaplains also give a comfort quilt to patients in the hospital that are dying. These quilts, made with love, provide comfort not only to the patient but to their family. After, the family takes the quilt home as a comfort to them. At this time, the hospital only has a couple of quilts left and are not able to get them from the source they had. If anyone has or knows of anyone who makes quilts and would like to donate, we would love to be able to give them to the hospital. Please bring them to the church and mark for the hospital. 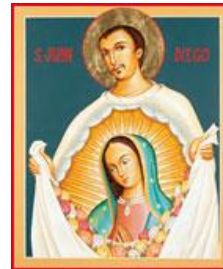
